## DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO OPERATE AMBULANCE FLIGHTS

For the operation of ambulance flights by a foreign Air Carrier to/from Aruba, a copy of the following documents must be submitted:

- 1. Air Operator Certificate (AOC).
- 2. Part of the Operations Specifications (OP-SPECS) manual where the authorized aircraft are specified.
- 3. Part of the Operations Specifications (OP-SPECS) manual where the authorized routes are specified.
- 4. Part of the Operations Specifications (OP-SPECS) manual where the air ambulance operation is specified.
- 5. Certificate of Airworthiness of the aircraft.
- 6. Certificate of Insurance of the aircraft.
- 7. Details of the itinerary to be operated.

**Note to item 2**: An aircraft that has been leased must be specified in the Air Carrier's OP-SPECS. **Note to item 5**: An Air Carrier that is using more than twelve (12) aircraft to operate into Aruba does not need to submit the certificate of airworthiness (item 2 will suffice).

- All the above-mentioned documents must be submitted seven (07) days before the date of operation. In case of an emergency, DCA Aruba will adjust its submission period as deemed just.
- Required documents that have expired or have been updated must be submitted as soon as possible.
- Arrival and departure time must be approved by the "Aruba Airport Authority" by seeking for Parking Slots.

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A separate Permit is required for the transportation of "Dangerous Goods".
